2021 Historic Landscape Preservation Fundraiser

How good it will be to celebrate Fall at Hills and Dales! The magnificent 13,000 square foot home, designed by Neel Reid and Hal Hentz, was completed in 1916. Today the fourth generation of the Callaway family welcomes visitors to the home, beautifully located in the sunny hills and shady dales of West Central Georgia. Plants dating back to the 1840s, 2½ acres of formal dwarf boxwood parterres, and twenty-six different varieties of deciduous magnolias are just a few of the many delights.

LaGrange is easily accessed, and a trip could be combined with a stay at Callaway Gardens! The day will feature tours of the historic home and gardens, a lecture by Jo Phillips entitled, "Heirloom Plants for Garden Fragrance," a box lunch, a welcome center with a film on Hills and Dales and a gift shop. The lecture begins at 10:30 and seating is limited to 90 attendees so plan to come early to hear this topic, or you can tour the house or gardens at your leisure upon arrival. Land Trust/Marshall Forest Caroline Alford

Marshall Forest has had more visitors this summer. Many more people are walking the trails and enjoying the ongoing trail improvements, on a daily basis. The parking lot has more cars as I pass by the forest each day. With social distancing still required for the unvaccinated, people are looking for places to be outside and safely enjoy the out of doors. Big Pine Braille Trail tours were conducted for area clubs upon request.

The following maintenance needs have been met.

- Andrew Saville, the son of a Garden Club Member, has kept the Pecan Field mowed and debris removed to make the area more accessible.
- The Fire Crew from The Nature conservancy did some trail maintenance and removal of invasive species.

Marshall Forest still has many things that need to be done to keep the trail well maintained and accessible to the physically impaired.

- Finish replacing the remaining guide rope posts.
- Reinstalling the guide ropes with climbing rope donated by a climbing gym in Marietta.
- Replacement of the bridge over the wet weather stream.
- Installation of crusher run gravel along the Braille Trail to provide more accessibility to the physically impaired.
- Creation of QR codes to provide trail maps, Forest information, and plant identification photos.
- Working with students at Berry College, we hope to create a video of a narrated walk through the forest.

The Nature Conservancy is working on a partnership with Berry College and Shorter University to create learning centers in the Pecan field and over to the Coosa River. The goal is to make the Marshall Forest a destination for student field trips.

The Nature Conservancy is investigating the possibility of a GOSA grant to do major upgrades to the Braille trail and create river access to the fields across from the Braille trial. The grant application would have to be in conjunction with the City of Rome and Floyd County.

Marshall Forest Deed of Gratitude certificates were given to the District Directors in April at the installation of officers in Athens.



The Douglas Garden Club was proud to receive a \$500 grant from the Plant America Grant Committee earlier this year. Club President, Lindsay Day, worked with her club members and local High School Agriculture teacher, Josh Rogers, to submit an application for the grant. Coffee High School in Douglas, GA recently completed the building of a new performing arts center on the high school campus. The center was named for late high school administrator Clayton Mathis who is the husband of long-time Douglas Garden Club member, Nedra Mathis. Mr. Mathis was a gifted horticulturist in our area and known for his love of camellias and shared his love of gardening with people all over the county.

The Douglas Garden Club wanted to further honor Mr. Mathis by landscaping and planting flower beds at the new building and thought it would be wonderful to work with Mr. Rogers and his students that are members of Future Farmers of America (FFA). The Douglas Garden Club also matched the Plant America Grant that was awarded and Josh and his students created a landscape plan that would brighten the exterior of the new building. Legislative Issues in Georgia

The Garden Club of Georgia belongs to the GA Water Coalition. Please share this information with your club members so that they may write to the Georgia EPD before Sept. 8th.



Coal Ash Waste

To protect communities around the state, the Georgia Water Coalition (GWC) is pursuing legislation that will:

- Ensure all of Georgia's toxic coal ash waste is stored in dry, lined, and capped facilities.
- Aggressively monitor coal ash storage facilities for leaks.
- Require public notification when coal ash waste threatens communities.
- Require producers of coal ash to provide drinking water when coal ash contamination is discovered in private drinking water wells.
- Keep coal ash landfills away from wetlands and fragile ecosystems.

At Plant Hammond near Rome, Georgia Power wants to leave more than 1 million tons of toxic coal ash sitting in groundwater along the Coosa River. And Georgia regulators are going to let them--unless you speak up. On July 12, the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) issued to Georgia Power a draft pollution permit for Ash Pond 3 to permanently bury toxic coal ash.



This is the first step towards giving Georgia Power the O.K. to leave behind approximately **50 million tons** of toxic coal ash in unlined pits around the state. Toxins in coal ash can contaminate private wells and the lakes and rivers we depend on for our drinking water. We can't leave this toxic legacy for future generations.
