Mary baked two cakes – one chocolate and one coconut – that I continue to snack on each night.

I feel loved. And, for the moment, I am not so conflicted as to doubt that I deserve it. Which might be the best gift of all.

Moments ago, my computer's fan started spinning loudly and out of control. My open applications seized. The machine froze, save for an atypical blowing sound, which was louder than a hairdryer set to

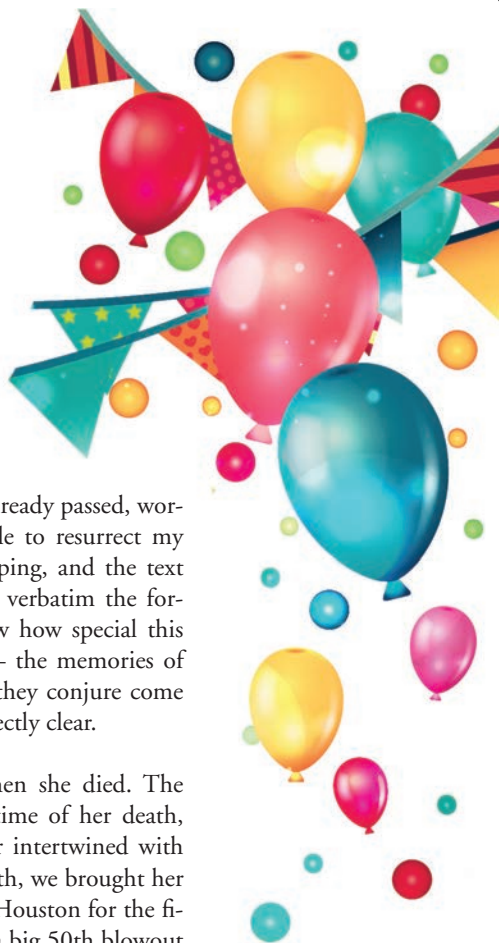

On the 14th, we brought her home from the hospital in Houston for the final time. She had planned a big 50th blowout for me; a week later we held a funeral instead.

Thanks to my parents for having me. As my father says, on birthdays we have more reason to celebrate the mother than the kid. It's true. My mom and dad did the hard work of raising me; I just showed up and started relying on them from the first day.

Regardless of my historical indifference to it, it's fun to feel special, even if it's just one day each year. If only my age matched the youthful image of myself that still hangs on the walls inside my mind.

PEDAL POWER

Riding a bike is for the most part a pleasure and, for some, a way to extend their fitness and well-being. As bikers do not have full access to the roads, we at The Landings are privileged to share paths with golf carts and runners. There are, however, sections of the road that require both bikers and motorists to share access points. For example – crossroads, traffic lights, and gate access.

Personally, I am fairly new to road biking (I have been biking for four years now) and was initially skeptical and anxious of the hazards...not to mention questioning my ability to perform the task itself. With my wife's encouragement, I "hit the trails" and started to love it. Biking, to me, is personal space that, while requiring awareness and caution, gives me the freedom to enjoy the sights and sounds of

our beautiful island and share greetings with some of the nicest folks.

There have been a few occasions when I felt my bike-riding was seriously intruding on some residents' freedom of the road. It's been my belief that larger vehicles would, as a matter of decency, give the right-of-way to pedestrians, golf carts and bike riders. The first time this occurred was when a motorist at the Deer Creek entrance attempted to squeeze through the gate when I was half way through myself. My immediate reaction was shock and fear for my safety, and then thought it must be an emergency (that prompted the rush). Later, I noticed the grocery store was their destination. On another occasion, while driving through Oakridge, a motorist felt comfortable taking a right hand turn after accelerating to overtake me. Collision was imminent, but for the driver behind them stopping to allow me access to middle of the road. This act of kindness far outweighed the inconsiderate driver's action.

Biking with my wife is always an enjoyable experience. Once, we decided to ride from Deer Creek to Delegal Marina. Getting there was fun and a bit of a challenge. Our return was abruptly intruded (upon) when a motorist at a crossroad was texting while driving and ignored my approaching wife. She required an ambulance and a visit to the emergency room. A neighbor ran home and fetched a blanket to make my wife comfortable while we waited for the ambulance. A random act of kindness is what we remember, and not the inconsiderate driver.

Biking is gaining momentum not only with younger generations but also among us more "mature" folks. The city of Savannah has planned extending bike paths and painting them blue. The island we live on is big enough for us to share the road, keeping in mind the three-foot rule when passing a biker. I hope that visiting families and their children would take back the pleasure of biking on a "safe" Skidaway.

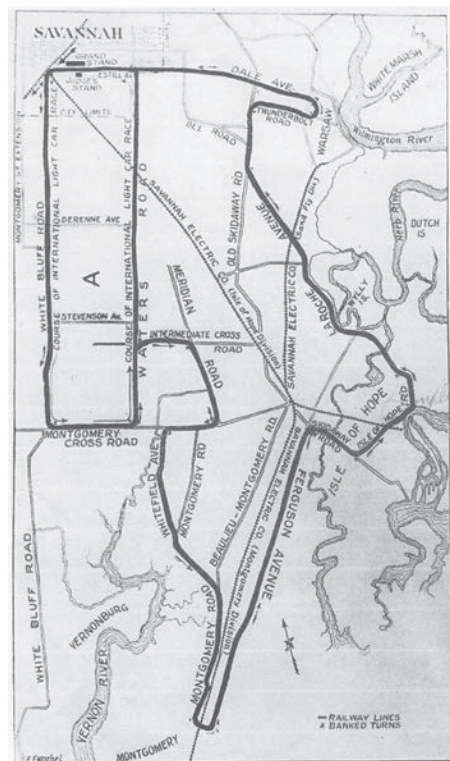

X (or a monument or plaque or something) MARKS THE SPOT

In 1908, at the dawn of the motor age, the Grand Prize of America Race was held in Savannah, drawing international attention to the Hostess City. Subsequent races were held in 1910 and 1911.

"The original track included the area down by Montgomery Crossroads and Sandfly, went all the way up to Victory Drive – in those days known as Dale Avenue – and through Isle of Hope," explains Landings resident Larry Koch. "It was all country roads. Ferguson Avenue, as we know it, was built as part of the racetrack."

At the intersection of Waters Avenue and East 46th Street is a commemorative plaque that reads in part: "These races which were run over a course of 17 miles of fine roads in Chatham County are considered by authorities as the greatest automobile road races held in this country. Of international interest

and importance, the events contributed their share in the development of the early automobile industry in America."

The legacy of the Grand Prize of America Race continues today. According to Koch, it eventually evolved into Formula One. The most influential manufacturers competing in the races more than 100 years ago were Fiat, Mercedes-Benz, and Renault. Today, the top three manufacturers in the Formula One racing series are Mercedes-Benz, Renault, and Fiat's sports car brand, Ferrari – the same three companies, in addition to Buick and Ford, who were also very involved with the Grand Prize.

Koch describes the very early 20th century as the true "Golden Age of Car Racing." In 1911, the Grand Prize of America Race had a turnout of 1,000 people – and only 15,000 people lived in Savannah at the time. That

year, Thomas Edison, Harvey Firestone and Henry Ford came to see the race, but they arrived late and couldn't find a place to stay. So they went into town and rented the jail and the city tossed out all the inmates and hosted just the three of them there.

A half-century later, racing remained an everyman's sport. In the 1950s, many races were held right out in the open on city streets on evenings and weekends. Race cars were sports cars; average vehicles owned by average people who enjoyed seeing how fast they could go. At the time, there was a huge boom in motor vehicle engineering and technology, and the spirit of competition was fierce. As the auto industry advanced, the public grew increasingly interested in racing. By the 1960s, auto racing was the biggest spectator sport in the country. From Savannah to Seattle, pitting cars and drivers and manufacturers against each other enthralled crowds, and emerging rock 'n roll music fueled the rebel spirit that compelled men to pursue speed.

Koch caught the wave of excitement during the era. While in grade school on Long Island in New York, a couple of his good friends' dads worked for car companies.

In high school, Koch thought, "If I could

get into the car business, what I'd love to do is develop a car that I could put my name on. Not necessarily the stylist designing it, but more like the engineer making it all work."

He graduated with a business degree, however. As a product planner for BMW, he worked with both stylists and engineers, collaborating to create a car that fit the market. "It takes about seven or eight years to develop a car, especially from scratch," he explains. "So by the time it goes down the assembly line and you see the first one in a showroom, you're both elated – and *really* done with it. You've moved on to something else and you think, 'Okay, I've been looking at it for eight years, it may be new to you but it's old news to me.'"

Eventually, Koch was named product manager for the BMW 7 Series, which included running BMW's race program. Currently, he is the event manager for the Savannah Speed Classic, part of the Hilton Head Motoring Festival and Concours d'Elegance. In 2006, event officials acquired and resurrected the one-run-wonder Indy car course on Hutchinson Island, originally built in 1997.

The Savannah Speed Classic has grown to an average of 5,000 spectators a year with 150 cars, including street vehicles, production models, and prototypes. It's a factory showcase closer to a motor vehicle version of the Westminster Dog Show than a NASCAR race.

Koch describes auto racing as a cocktail of entertainment, spectators, sponsorships, and more entertainment. "It becomes an increasing circle," he says, "and we're in the process of making that circle for the Savannah Speed Classic. It's a challenge, but really with any sport – car racing, horse racing, football – it's all about that circle."

The 2019 Speed Classic is Thursday, October 24, through Sunday, October 27, in conjunction with the Hilton Head Motoring Festival and

Concours d'Elegance, slated for October 24, through November 3. For more information, visit hbiconcours.com.

Ovarian Cancer

A SILENT KILLER

Gynecologic oncologist Dr. Sarah Gill explains risk factors, warning signs of ovarian cancer

Ovarian cancer is not a particularly common female reproductive cancer, but it can be very deadly.

"Ovarian cancer is often viewed as a 'silent killer' because it has proven so difficult to detect in its early stages," Gill, of St. Joseph's/Candler Gynecologic Oncology and Surgical Specialists, says. "Unfortunately, the disease is most often diagnosed at an advanced stage, when it has spread to other areas of the abdomen, pelvis, chest and other parts of the body."

More than 22,500 women will be diagnosed with ovarian cancer this year in the U.S., according to the American Cancer Society. Of them, more than half will die from the disease, ranking fifth in cancer deaths among women, and accounting for more deaths than any other cancer of the female reproductive tract.

Ovaries are reproductive glands found on each side of the uterus. They are positioned deep within the pelvis, which prevents them from being seen and reliably examined by medical providers. Currently, there is no proven method of screening for early detection of ovarian cancer. Ovarian cancer is only definitively diagnosed with tissue analysis or biopsy.

"Yearly pelvic exams and Pap smears do

not screen for ovarian cancer, but are still important to screen for cervical cancer and other women's health issues," Gill says.

Because ovarian cancer can be hard to diagnose early, it's important to understand the risk factors and possible symptoms of the disease.

RISK FACTORS

There are several risk factors for ovarian cancer including:

- Age – about half of the women diagnosed with ovarian cancer are 63 or older
- Family history of ovarian cancer
- Certain familial genetic mutations
- Nulliparity, meaning a woman has never given birth
- Early menstruation or late menopause
- Endometriosis
- Obesity

"Other risk factors have been suggested but not definitively proven in other studies, such as polycystic ovarian syndrome, diet and others," Gill says. "Talc and its contribution to the risk of ovarian cancer has been a hot topic lately, but the evidence does not definitively support an increased risk of ovarian cancer with exposure."

SYMPTOMS

Another reason ovarian cancer is hard to detect: It's often asymptomatic. The only early warning sign you might discover are ovarian cysts or masses. If you frequently experience any of the following symptoms, you should talk to your doctor right away:

- Abdominal bloating
- Abdominal pain
- Changes in bowel or bladder habits
- Weight loss
- Inability to eat a normal meal due to a feeling of fullness

TREATMENT OPTIONS

At Gynecologic Oncology and Surgical Specialists, Gill and fellow gynecologic oncologist, Dr. Edward Richards, treat women suspected of having ovarian cancer or those already diagnosed. They offer surgery and other options to first obtain a diagnosis and then evaluate and treat any abnormal findings. The majority of women with ovarian cancer will first have surgery, called cytoreductive, or debulking, surgery, to remove as much of the cancer as possible. Once patients recover from surgery, chemotherapy is typically given in order to treat any remaining disease and achieve the best chance at a cure. In some women where the cancer has spread to areas where it cannot safely be removed with surgery, chemotherapy is given before cytoreductive surgery (neoadjuvant chemotherapy), which is then followed with more chemotherapy.

Currently, there are promising clinical trials in ovarian cancer offered to patients at the Nancy N. and J.C. Lewis Cancer and Research Pavilion. In one trial, the patient receives chemotherapy first and they have subsequent opportunity to receive an additional drug shown to have impact in improving outcomes for ovarian cancer patients in combination with standard chemotherapy.

Exercise Program Improves Movement Disorder Patients' Quality-of-Life

Eight-week class starts October 8 at the St. Joseph's/Candler Wellness Center

Exercise is important for everyone. It's known to reduce the risk of life-threatening illnesses, such as diabetes and heart disease. Exercise is also vital for people with movement disorders, helping them with balance and mobility.

ty-of-life through different forms of exercise and education," Stephanie Beall, exercise physiologist with the Wellness Center, says. "We want to enhance their sense of wellbeing and confidence through improving their strength, posture and balance."

A movement disorder is defined as one of a group of neurological conditions causing involuntary or abnormal movement. Common movement disorders include Parkinson's disease, essential tremor and restless leg syndrome.

St. Joseph's/Candler offers an eight-week program to help patients with movement disorders exercise in a safe and nurturing environment. The Wellness in Movement program is offered through the St. Joseph's/Candler Wellness Center. It started in the fall of 2017. The next class begins October 8. Participants meet once a week for one hour. Each session includes a different activity or educational lecture. The first week, for example, consist of a seminar on how to safely exercise with a movement disorder. Participants will learn aerobic training, resistance and balance exercises, to improve strength, posture and gait.

Classes and lecture topics include:

- Chair aerobics
- Mindful meditation
- Boxing
- Tai Chi
- Nutrition

"Our goal is to help people with movement disorders achieve a better quality-

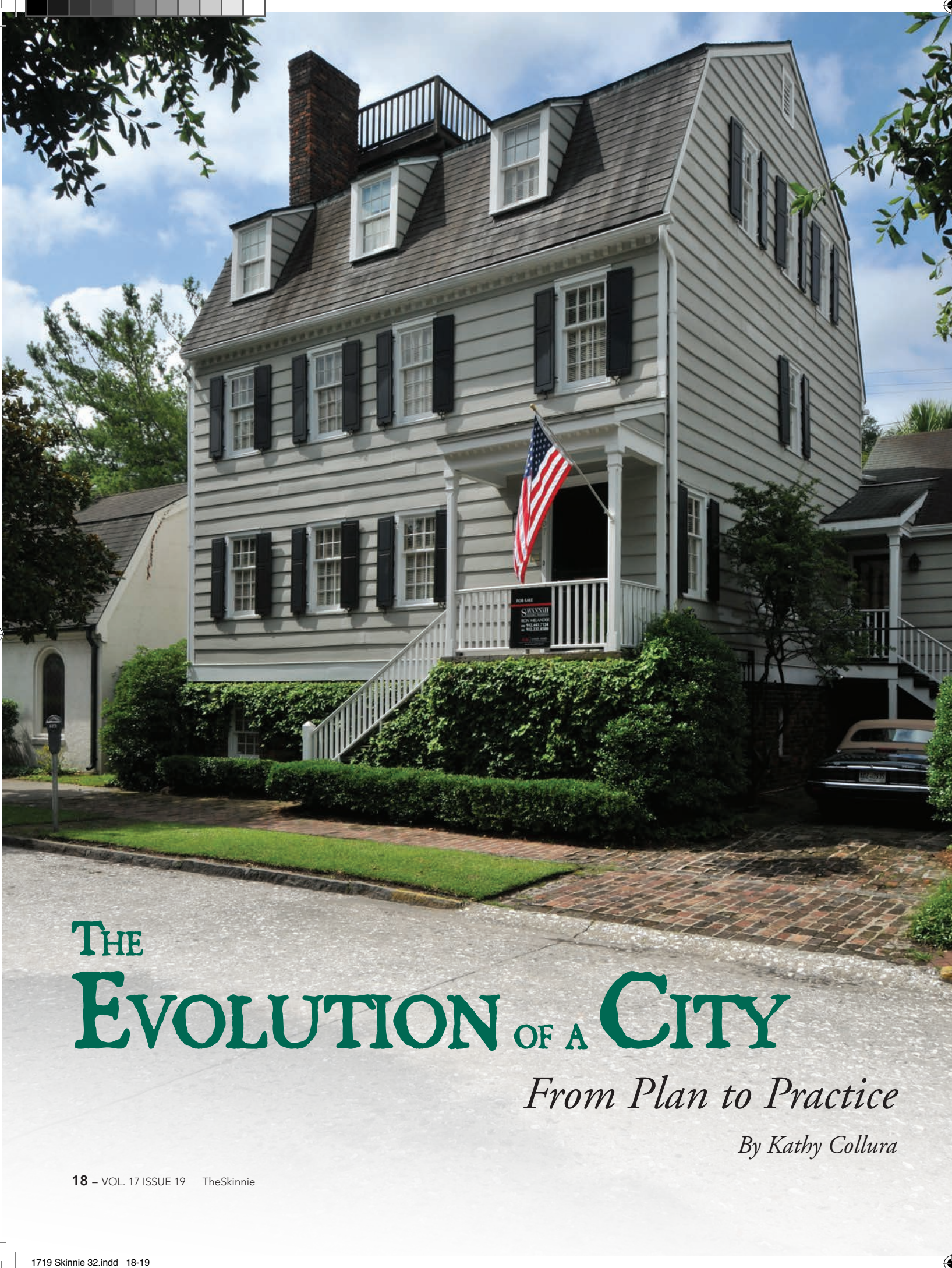
Research has shown that exercise helps patients with movement disorders improve their confidence, flexibility, posture and strength. In some patients, is believed to slow down the progression of a disease, such as Parkinson's. Beall has seen it firsthand.

"It's amazing to see some of our participants start the class nervous and questioning if they can do this, but by the end of the eight weeks, they have noticeably better balance and strength, and they are excited to exercise," Beall says.

Program participants may join the Wellness Center at the end of the eight weeks or find another outlet for exercise. It's important to continue physical activity to maintain and improve balance, strength and range of motion.

This program is not meant to replace physical or occupational therapy. It's a tool to help people with movement disorders manage their symptoms.

Wellness in Movement is free for Wellness Center members and Silver Sneakers. It's \$120 for others. The next class starts at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, October 8. Sign up by calling the Wellness Center at 912.819.8800.



THE EVOLUTION OF A CITY

From Plan to Practice

Savannah is home to well-known buildings, landmarks and green spaces. Just mentioning Savannah to a non-resident conjures visions of the many squares, the Forsyth Park Fountain, the Wormsloe live oak allée, Bonaventure Cemetery, and the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. However, in addition to these glamorous stars, there are many supporting players that add immeasurably to the city's beauty.

Robin B. Williams has been chair of Architectural History at the Savannah College of Art and Design since the department's founding in 1995. Since joining SCAD, Williams has made Savannah the focus of his research, extensively investigating many of the lesser known gems in the cityscape. His observations are compiled in his book, *Buildings of Savannah*.

Williams is active in the civic arena design discussions, and serves on local, state and national boards relating to his professional expertise. On October 14, he will speak at the Landings Garden Club Heritage Luncheon.

THE MAN WITH A PLAN

In 1733, Gen. James Oglethorpe's plan was largely agricultural, with the city surrounded by garden plots, farmland and the experimental Trustee's Garden. Within the town, the squares were conceived primarily as public green places. The urban plan employed a neighborhood unit, or ward, as its basic module, which was repeated to form a six-ward town – four wards laid out in 1733 and two more a year later. In addition to his detailed plan for what is now the historic district, Oglethorpe's regional plan showed great foresight, including a

series of approximately 60 one-mile tracts of land for farm lots, which informed the location of major thoroughfares as the suburbs developed in the 18th and 19th centuries. It's easy to see this today, driving down Habersham, Abercorn, and other streets south of the historic district through Victorian-era neighborhoods and Ardsley Park.

The 1790 city council voted to retain Oglethorpe's ward plan as the basis for the city's first expansion. Citizens, visitors and civic officials recognized the unique merits of the plan and replicated it for six expansions, yielding a total of 24 wards by the 1850s, while each expansion modified Oglethorpe's plan in some way. Today, the city council is considering options to restore a lost square from Oglethorpe's original plan when the current civic center is demolished. This adherence to Oglethorpe's original vision is unique among American cities.

PARKS, PROMENADES AND SECRET GARDENS

Since Savannah's founding, residents have prized their private gardens. The gardens of the Andrew Low House on Lafayette Square are original to the house, laid out in the European style of the 1850s when the house was constructed. Close by, the privately-owned Battersby-Hartridge house, as well as the family home at Wormsloe, also nurture historic gardens that their owners occasionally open for public events and tours. House and garden tours are among Savannah's most popular springtime activities.

Beginning in 1793, the municipal government passed ordinances to promote and regulate the planting of trees as ornaments on each side of the city's streets and in the squares. The move was a bold one; at the time, other cities regarded trees as fire hazards. The city's tree-

lined boulevards, as well as the establishment of Forsyth park in 1851 as one of the earliest municipal parks in the nation, inspired people of the 19th century to call Savannah "Forest City."

Savannah's "forest" has changed over time. The land was a dense pine forest when Oglethorpe arrived, and pines continued to dominate the landscape until they were largely obliterated by the hurricane of 1893. This natural thinning led to the planting of live oaks that today are prominent in the squares, along boulevards, and in parks. Estill and Dale avenues were the southern border of the city until the late 19th century. With the development of the adjacent Chatham Crescent in 1910, 460 palmetto trees were planted along the boulevard of these streets, which would be renamed Victory Drive in 1923 to commemorate the nation's role in World War I. As the city contin-

ued to expand southward, the developers of Ardsley Park included five one-acre parks inspired by the squares of the Historic District.

DIFFERENTIATE, MOVE, ADAPT AND RESTORE

While the Savannah city plan is still largely intact, Savannah housing is a story of change. Homes built before 1800 are somewhat rare, due to fires and hurricanes.

The home of Revolutionary War leader, Gen. Lachlan McIntosh, at 110 East Oglethorpe Avenue, is one of the oldest homes in Savannah. A local builder purchased the lot in 1764 and erected the house, perhaps as a tavern, as early as 1765. The original two-story, side-gabled, Georgian central-hall house is barely discernible today beneath its second floor iron balcony and disproportionately tall third floor addition. The Droulliard-Maupaus House at 2422 Abercorn Street is the most authentic example of a coastal Creole cottage in Savannah, featuring a lower level built of original Savannah grey brick.

The Frederick Ball House on Habersham Street defies local convention by facing the side of the lot rather than the square. The side-hall house with a four-bay façade is efficiently heated by an interior chimney centered between the two rooms; unusual in Savannah. An abundance of windows provides cross-ventilation for summer cooling.

The 200 block of West Bolton Street is one of the most varied – yet harmonious – ensembles of residential architecture in Savannah, displaying various scales, heights, shapes and styles.

The row of houses at 601-711 Whitaker Street is a veritable textbook on prevailing residential styles during the late 19th century, including Italianate, Queen Anne, and Second Empire styles.

Dulany Industries headquarters and Sexton Hall Mortuary on 118 East 35th Street are located in a Beaux-Arts classical house built in 1911. Its grandiose design well-represents the Thomas Square neighborhood, the wealthiest residential neighborhood of its day.

A year after the Housing Authority of Savannah was formed in 1938, construction began on Yamacraw Village. Bounded by West Bay, Ann, Zubley and York Streets, the 480 subsidized rental units were built in widely spaced parallel rows of two-story multi-family blocks. The homes’ architecture and layout attempt to echo historic Savannah row house design with wide paths instead of streets. Innovatively, hot water was supplied by solar units on the buildings roofs from the time they were constructed until 1968.

The Starland Design District is a complete neighborhood revitalization project of about 40 blocks, centered on the former Starland Dairy at 2424 DeSoto Avenue. The facility was transformed into the Starland Lofts in 2006, providing Savannah its first clean, contemporary modular units.

Savannah Gardens, located on Pennsylvania Avenue between East Gwinnett and Elgin Streets, was built in 2007 as a collaboration of Mercy Housing Southeast, the City of Savannah, and the Community Housing Service Agency. The 44-acre site retains the innovative

sweeping arcs of the former defense housing that previously occupied the site. A central park and formal axis are typical of late 20th century New Urbanism. *Author’s note: Much of the material in this article is adapted directly from Buildings of Savannah by Robin B. Williams.*
