PLANTS AND CONSERVATION



This beautiful spring weather makes us anxious fill our yard and porches with colorful plants. For the birds and butterflies, select bright tubular blossoms. Plant baskets of Fucia, Columbine, red or blue Salvia, Impatiens, Lupines or Phlox. New plants also need to be watered two or three times a week and it is easy if they are in a container. Water is getting to be a scarce and expensive commodity so use it sparingly. Turn off the sprinkler system and water only when necessary. Established bushes need only one inch a week. Monitor the amount of rainfall and add enough to total one inch. Use a bucket to catch the rain for use in the birdbath or on the flowers. Enjoy our colorful plantings but be mindful of the water. 
