If you have never been to a garden club state convention, consider attending this year while it is being held in our own backyard! You can attend the entire event or pick and choose the day or days you would like to participate. Here is a synopsis of what will be happening;

On Wednesday April 15 the convention kicks off with a 90 minute Jekyll Island Historic District Tram Tour. “Our Wild Birds from the Backyard to the Beach” workshop, led by Lydia Thompson, will also be provided in the afternoon.

Wednesday night’s coastal dinner, a Low Country Boil, will feature keynote speaker Paul Medders with the DNR whose program is “Explore Coastal Georgia.”

You can enjoy interactive exhibits, photographs, videos, oral histories and artifacts that tell the story of this Academy’s past, present, and future. Learn how this part of Georgia history has evolved from an orphanage into an innovative school for boys in grades 6 to 12. We will have a guided tour through the museum after which we will tour the grounds. Our cost of \$8 helps provide financial aid for Bethesda students.
