The Skidaway Farm project will start up again in Spring, after a rest through the coldest weeks of Winter. On March 28, the "Done in a Day" group will help with planting the plot for spring. Our last frost date in Savannah is generally around March 24, so planting tomatoes before that date is risky. Lettuce seeds and cherry tomato seeds have already been sown in anticipation of planting day. Soil amendments (composted manure) will be added in early March.

We are looking forward to partnering with UGA Extension Master Gardeners to provide their expert advice and hands-on gardening. All produce grown and harvested in the Landings Garden Club plot is donated and gratefully received by the Social Apostolate of Savannah, a Catholic Charities Outreach program. Helping with this project is a great way to learn about growing vegetables on Skidaway Island.
