
Attracting pollinators into a garden takes time and patience. Garden site selection and host plants are critical to develop a pollinator habitat. Choose a sunny location in your yard with a good vantage point for viewing. Spend time researching about the butterflies you would like to attract and remember that regional butterflies perfer specific native pollinator and host plants. Look around your neighborhood to see what plants are attracting pollinators or visit the Pollinator Berm on Bartram Road.

Garden Tips to Attract Skidaway Pollinators











*Attracting Pollinators into a garden takes time & patience. Garden site selection & host plants are critical to develop a Pollinator habitat.

*Native plants that attract butterflies require full or part sun. You will most likely need to improve soil content with compost & nutrient rich top soil.

* Some of the Host Pollinator Plants are browsed by deer especially in the fawn season. Different parts of Skidaway Island have more deer than others & some plants in one neighborhood may be left alone, but eaten to the ground in another.

The Skidaway Farm Project completed another 'Warm Season' of growing vegetables for charitable giving. The Social Apostolate was the latest recipient of our organically grown vegetables. Grown in the plot this summer were: Tomatoes, Peppers, Lettuce, Eggplant, Okra, Basil, Dill, and Parsley. The last of the Okra ('Jing Orange' & Green Okra) was harvested at the end of August. The plot is now covered to rest the soil. We will be uncovering to add soil ammendments in late September. Extra hands for planting, harvesting, and weeding are always welcome!

The Landings Garden Club "Urn Angels" have been busy this summer tending to the many garden planters throughout The Landings Club campus. With a roster of 27 volunteers, they are divided into 5 teams which service Deer Creek, Marshwood, Oakridge Fitness, Franklin Creek and the North Entrance Gate. Each location has a team leader who coordinates the watering schedule and seasonal planting. The team captain creates a monthly or weekly responsibility for each volunteer.

The price of plants has tripled thus variety and availability of plant material has been a significant factor in selection and quantity for each planter. An effort has been made to choose drought resistant, as well as cost efficient plant material. The next seasonal change-out to refresh urns that are tired and less productive is scheduled for November.

The 'Urn Angles" have been active for 6 years. Adorned with Purple Aprons, they work to distinguish themselves for TLC Members and visitors to the various clubs. During this time they have made a signigicant contribution to the Landings welcoming atmosphere and appearance. Visitors to these venues are always gracious and generous with their appreciation for the hard work and beautification of the clubs.

This practice has evolved through a study of natural areas throughout the Coastal Plain and the desire to express a distinct sense of regionalism and low-key southern charm in site design.
