
Georgia Ecoregions

The state of Georgia has more biodiversity than any state east of the Mississippi River. The state has 3 cold-hardiness zones (7-9). It is also divided into 6 ecoregions.

An ecoregion is defined by its natural communities. Georgia's ecoregion are: Blue Ridge, Cumberland Plateau/Ridge and Valley, Piedmont, Coastal Plain and Maritime. The Maritime region is defined as the area from Savannah south to St. Marys, all of the barrier islands and about 60 miles inland. This region includes natural communites like intertidal, wetlands, maritime forests, salt marshes, etc. Each natural community also has its own wildlife. For instance, the Maritime community is home to the Diamondback Terrapin and the Gopher Tortoise.


'Gather your local knowledge' is an important statement to remember when gardening on Skidaway Island. Skidaway Island is 8 miles long and 3 miles wide. It is part of the 9A cold-hardiness zone and it's part of the Maritime ecoregion.

If you are interested in discovering more about Geogia's ecoregions, I recommend reading 'The Natural Communities of Georgia' by Edwards, Ambrose and Kirkman. This book gives more details on each ecoregion and which plants and wildlife you will find within the regions. Having this knowledge will make your Maritime gardening here on Skidaway more successful and enjoyable.

Skidaway Farms Submitted by Meg Kettlitz



Jayne Rogers received a \$100 grant from the Coastal Master Gardeners Association to do a solarization of our farm plot. This entailed placing a clear plastic tarp over the garden plot thus allowing the sun to heat up the soil which in turn eliminates any unwanted pests and weed seeds.

Most of the committee members chose a week to check on the soil temperature which we recorded along with weather data (sun and air temp). We had a successful 14 weeks and then removed the clear plastic and conducted a soil sample which was submitted to UGA. As of the writing of this article, we have not received results back but expect they will tell us what soil ammendments we will need to add.

Recoginiton and thanks goes out to Jayne Rogers for all of her hard work and chairmanship of the Skidaway Farms project for the past 3 years.

I would like to personally thank all of our committee members for their efforts and look forward to starting our cool season planting around the end of September.

Field Trip - Sparrow Field September 28, 2024 - 10:00 am



Did you know that Skidaway Island is home to an incredible pollinator garden? Join us on Saturday, September 28 for an informative tour lead by Dawn Cordo and her volunteers at Sparrow Field.

The Pollinator Berm at Sparrow Field boasts a diverse display of over 100 flowering plant species that attract nearly 200 documented bees, wasps, flies, butterflies, dragonflies and damselflies. In addition, dozens of species of birds congregate to nest in nearby trees and thickets filling the air with a choir of birdsong for all to enjoy.

Spanning 3 1/4 acres, the Sparrow Field Pollinator Berm was previously a sod farm utilized by The Landings Club and stands out as a unique habitat within our community, drawing birds not commonly found elsewhere on the island. Careful consideration goes into selecting plants that best support the different bird and insect species that inhabit this area.

Honeybees are among the newsest residents at Sparrow Field. John and Elena Boshier came to The Landings with 12 years of beekeeping experience and have established two honeybee colonies. They will be on hand to share their vast knowledge about bees, beekeeping and the important role bees play in food production and nature.

You won't want to miss this informative tour. There is so much to see, learn, and enjoy at this garden. Sparrow Field also provides an opportunity to fulfill your DONE IN A DAY requirement. Dawn welcomes all volunteers on a regular basis. If you would like to become involved with various research projects or help maintain the garden, they meet every Friday morning at 9:00 am.

Welcome Back!

I hope everyone had a great summer and your gardens were flush with fresh vegetables and herbs. My garden is my go-to for everything I cook so I thought it would be fun to give some tidbits every month of my favorite recipes and garden tips.

This month I'm sharing a super easy and healthy recipe that my family loves, Grilled Shrimp on the Barbie. Spruce this entree up with some fresh grilled veggies, toss in a salad, add some crusty bread and dinner's served!

Grilled Shrimp on the Barbie

1.5 lbs. Colossal Shrimp (aprox. 10-12 shrimp)

Marinade

1T fresh parsely, chopped
3 sprigs fresh thyme (strip leaves off stem & discard stem)
1/2 t Hungarian paprika (hot or sweet)
Citrus: Zest from one lemon, lime, or half orange
Himalayan or Scillian Salt and ground peppercorns
Splash of fabulous balsamic vinegar
Combine all marinade ingredients



Wash shrimp & devein but leave shells on. This helps to trap the marinade while grilling.

Marinade the shrimp for 30-60 minutes, max Grill shrimp on hot BBQ, cooking 3-4 minutes on each side. Baste or pour marinade onto shimp while cooking. I do not recommend using skewers, the shrimp are large enough to grill individually.
